Parental support is vital in helping your child to succeed and enjoy reading, not just at St George's but throughout their education and life.

In KS2 we teach reading fluency and comprehension.


Fluency teaching, builds on KS1 practice by applying phonics and increasing sight vocabulary. Provision is in place for those children who still require phonics focus in KS2 but fluency is mostly taught through modelling by reading aloud to the children and by asking them to read to a partner or small group. We ask the children to try and look at whole lines and sentences and pick out punctuation clues to help with expression. Comprehension is taught by focussing on \neq skills which the children revisit on a weekly cycle. The skills are listed below and your child will be able to tell you what each of them mean. They can try to use some of these as they are reading to you.

Comprehension reading skills:

- * Prediction— Ask your child what they think will happen (not a guess).
- * Questioning— Ask a question about what is read so your child can say what type of open or closed question it is: Right There, Vocabulary, Think & Search, Evaluating.
- * Clarifying— Encourage your child to stop and read around a word to work out what it means.
- * Summarising— Ask your child if they can explain in a sentence or two, what they have read in a chapter, page or book.
- * Inferring- Ask your child if they can think of why a character is acting in a certain way or what they might be feeling.
- * Making Connections— Are there any other books, films, places or people the children have had experience of, that remind them of what they are reading?
- * Evaluating— Can your child work out what effect the author is trying to create or why a book is set out in a certain way?



Your child will be benchmarked at least every term until they are a 'free reader'. They will be given or can choose a colour-coded book which they can



All children in KS2 have a Bug Club login so they can access a range of books and text types at their matched colour code via tablets or laptops at home.

Reading rewards scheme

To motivate and encourage pupils to read at home, we have a reward programme. We expect a child to read daily and the reading record to be signed. The more occasions, the greater the rewards.

In school reading spine

Children will read a range of fiction, non fiction and poetry, from a range of sources including newspapers, comics and online resources. Daily reading in K.S.2 is called **Destination Reader** where children will read a range of books by authors who are from different backgrounds, cultures, nationalities, genders and times. The books are organised across Years

354 and Years 556 according to the age of the pupils, time of the year, interests, authors, topic themes and literary heritage. The book spine for each phase is listed over the page. Please talk to your child about the book they are reading in class and you can even get books by the same authors or from the same series from the library.
